The contract is a most one-sided affair, and if entered into would put the local exchange entirely at the mercy of the Brownwood company. Mr. Paxton has so far been unable to reach a satisfactory adjustment with them, and he was asking the council for some protection.

It seems that the Brownwood concern threatens to take their long distance business entirely away from Mr. Paxton, establishing separate booths in this city, and denying him the long distance connections. The council assured Mr. Paxton that all protection in their power would be given him. The Standard trusts that a satisfactory solution of the problem can be had. Mr. Paxton is spending a big bunch of money in improving the local system, and in a few months Brady will have a telephone system the equal of any in the state, and the long distance people

should not be allowed to cripple the business and the service by arbitrary tactics.





Score another victory for the improved cotton seed and the "dry farming" method of culture in McCulloch county. W. M. Harris, who is farming on the Jim Williamson place this side of Rochelle, planted the Mahian Triumph cotton and cultivated his crop according to the latest approved methods as advocated by the government. He took two loads of seed cotton to the gin, each load weighing 1370 pounds, and got two bales of lint each weighing 532 1-2 pounds. Another load of seed cotton weighing 1415 pounds yielded a bale weighing 537 pounds. So far he has secured sixteen bales of cotton and is still picking.


