AUTOMOBILE ACCIDENT

Menard Citizen Knocked Down and injured by Automobile on Blackburn Street Monday Evening.

Just before dark last evening Mr. Harryman, a carpenter from Menard, was struck by an automobile driven by Dr. Wm. C. Jones just opposite the Jones lumber yard on Blackburn street.

Dr. Jones was driving slowly, and at the time was carefully swerving to one side of the street to avoid frightening Mr. Harryman's team. Mr. Harryman was on the opposite side of the street from his team, and glanced around just in time to note that possibly the horses were becoming restless. Without taking note of the approaching auto he started to run to his team and sprang right in front of the machine which struck him and knocked him down. Dr. Jones stopped his car immediately and helped convey the injured man to a nearby residence. Dr. A. S. Holley was summoned and found Mr. Harryman painfully injured about the back, but states this morning that he does not think the injuries will prove serious though Mr. Harryman will probably be confined to his room for several days.

No blame attaches to Dr. Jones for the accident. He is one of the most careful drivers in the city, and was proceeding with his usual caution at the time of the accident.
