Many die of thumps and sore mouth, while quite young. Loss from these causes can be minimized by giving the sow and her litter special care. They can be protected from being overlaid by the sow by having a fender made of a scantling, rail or pole securely fastened around the wall of the pen eight inches from the floor. By having this it prevents the sow from crushing the little fellows against the wall, and saves the lives of many pigs.

One of the most important essen-One of the most important essentials in pig growing is exercise. That is one thing the ng., in order to do well, must have. When pigs are kept penned up all the time, and the food they eat is fattening and does not contribute to any material extent to his growth, and this causes fat to form around the pig's heart, bringing on what is called "thumps," which generally results in death. This can be avoided by giving pigs freedom while young.

Many feeders make the mistake of Many feeders make the mistake of allowing the sow and her litter to sleep in a dusty bed, the pigs breathing the dust, which causes a cough, also sore mouth, which often causes death. They should be permitted to sleep out in the open air. The sow should not be fed heavy milk producing feeds will a week or too after ducing foods until a week or two after farrowing. The pig is very much like a colt. If the mother is fed heavy milk producing foods when they are young they are quite liable to take ours and death results

The sow should be fed thin slops with a little ground grain mixed in for a week after farrowing. But after pigs are old enough to out all the milk that the provides for them she should be fed enough grain in addition to having good pasture to keep her in good con-dition.

The pig that makes the most profit-

able gains is the one that is not allowed to squeal for feed and is pushed from start to finish. If the pig is ever allowed to become stunted it takes all the profit to ever get him started to growing and fattening again, and no good feeder will allow this to occur.

It should be understo that not all of the clay out of which the road is to be constructed is to clinkered, but only a sufficient amou. should be rendered nonplastic t tralize the too sticky character of the native clay.

Good sound wood, as dry and wel easoned as it is possible to procura should be provided before beginning the work and stacked at convenient intervals along the side of the road. About one cord of wood has been found necessary for eight linear feet of road-

bed twelve feet wide. After grading the road to an even width between ditches it is plowed up as deeply as practicable. It will be found necessary to use horses or to burn twelve feet of roadway the transverse furrows should be sixteen each side beyond the width of the final roadway. Across the ridges formed between these furrows, which should be about four feet apart, the first course of cord wood is laid longitudinally so as to form a series of flues in which the firing is started.

The best and soundest cord wood is selected for this course and should be laid so that the pieces will touch, thus forming a floor. Another layer of wood is thrown irregularly across this floor, in crib formation, with spaces left between in which the lumps of

clay are piled. After the lumps of clay have been heaped upon this floor a third course of wood is laid parallel to the first This third course is laid in exactly the same manner as the first, and each opening and erack should be filled with brush, chips, bark, small sticks or any other combustible material. The top tayer of clay is placed over all, and the finer portions of the material are heaped over the whole structure.

The deep covering of clay which is thrown over all should be taken from the side ditches and may be in lumps of all sizes, including the very finest material. It is spread as everly as pos-

Had The Old Man Down.

Johnson county, Texas, has a boys' corn club that believes in doing things. At a late meeting the reports showed that the farmer boys of that county who have taken up the new agriculture are raising more than the experienced "practical" farmers. As an example we quote this report of one of the boys:

This boy wanted to plant his acre, but his father told him he could not do it. The boy fell back upon a boy's best friend, his mother, and she took the matter up with the "old man" and the boy got his acre of ground. That was three seasons ago. He plowed, hoed and worked his crop, and so did his daddy his, and when the corn was measured the boy had made 32 bushels to the acre and the "old man" only eleven. By this time the father had got his dander up and determined he would adopt some of the new measures and keep up with his son, so last year they both went at it, but the boy had learned his lesson well, and when the time came for measuring results he had 42 bushels average to the acre, while the "old man" had only increased to 14 bushels. This year the "old man" determined that he would beat his boy sure, but he didn't. When things were ready and the father was away from home, the boy took a wagon and hauled a good lot of manure onto his land, plowed it under and went ahead. When the measuring day came that season the "old man" had moved up quite a lot, having an average of 42 bushels to the acre, but the boy measured out 62 bushels to the acre, and had the "old man" down sure.


