The City council meeting in regular session Monday, ordered an election to be held Saturday,
March 25th, for the purpose of March 25th, for the purpose of
voting on the issuance of $\$ 40,000$ voting on the issuance of $\$ 40,100$
water bonds. S. M. McCollum was appointed Presiding Judge; John M. Duke, Assistant Judge: John E. Cooke and C. H. Bradley clerks.
The water question has long been a serious problem in Brady,

bonds for the purpose of erecting a series of chain dams on Brady creek seems to be the only possidle way to settle the question For all time to come. By means of these dams and the use of a filtering plant Brady will have a supply of water sufficient for a
