

a matter of right and that the corporation impounding such waters have the right to use all water as impounded.

A different doctrine obtains, however, and is specially pro-Revised Statutes in regard to the ordinary flow or underflow of running waters. This Article reads as follows:

"The ordinary flow or underflow of the running water; of every natural stream within as deep as the soil would per those portions of Texas described in Article 3115 may be diverted from its natural channel for irrigation, mining, milling, the construction of water works for cities or towns or stock-raising; provided that such flow or underflow of water shall not be diverted to the prejudice of the rights of the riparian owner without his consent except after condemnation thereof in the manner as hereinafter provided."

Secretary Hardison reported on the financial conditions of the club, his report showing a neat sum on hand.


