#### MENARD'S GALA DAY

Newest Railroad Town on the Map With Assistance of 5,000 Visitors Celebrates Arrival of Frisco.

Menard celebrated the greatest day in her history last Saturday, when the first regular passenger train rumbled down the track amid cheers, honking autos and tumultuous applause. Four trains carried excursionists into the city, the first being the Brady special, the second was the Brownwood special, the third the Rugular passenger, and the fourth the Fort Worth special. The Brady and the Fort Worth cars carried huge banners strung alonside the car, as did also the private car of the Richey-De-Freest Land Co. Brady and Rochelle badges, fluttering from coat lapels, were very much in evidence everywhere on the grounds, as were also the badges bearing the motto "On to Sono-

The Menard citizens had set long tables out in the beautiful grove where sixteen beeves, ten goats and ten sheep had been barbecued, and dinner was served in an abundance that left not the least pang of hunger among the five thousand visitors.

### A PLAIN STATEMENT

Water Committee Explains in Full Their Plans for Providing City With Abundant Water Supply.

Last summer when Brady' water supply became exhaust ed, the City Council appointed a committee to see the water company with a view to ascertain whether or not they were willing to take such steps as were necessary to secure for ty a permanent water supply.

The Brady Water & Light Co. had done their best , hav ing previously gone to much ex pense in the matter, and their reply was that they did not are to spend and would no expend a sufficient amount of money to secure a permanent and adequate supply of water.

The matter was thus passed p squarely to the city, and at meeting called by the Mayor for the purpose, six citizens were appointed, by request of he Council to share with them he responsibility of solving our water problem. The citizens elected are F. M. Richards, G . Gansel, W. D. Crothers, D ranville, F. M. Newman, and F. Montgomery.





The figures for the cotton crop of the season of 1908-09 are available, and we will quote from them briefly:

There were marketed that year 50,000 bales in Brady at an average price of 81.2c per pound. The bales averaged 520 pounds, thus making an average price of \$45 per bale-about half the price per bale during the season just closing.

Fifty thousand bales at \$45 gives us \$2,250,000 for the cotton int. There were also 25,000 tons of seed which sold at an average price of \$15 per ton, or a total value of \$375,000 for the seed alone. Add the two amounts and you have a grand total of \$2,625,000 paid to the farmers for the season's crop.

These figures indicate that here's good money made in cotton raising in McCulloch county. Of course these figures cover the banner year for cotton raising in the county, but it must also be considered that the prices paid that year were below the average, some of the staple selling than during the big year. 



### CONSERVE WATER

Bill Introduced in the State Senate to Cover Demands For Relief by Residents on Banks of Streams.

Judge Joe A. Adkins is in receipt of word from our State Senator, Col. Bill Adams, to the effect that a bill has been introduced in the Senate by Senator Willacy and himself which he thinks will cover all demands for relief on the part of residents along the banks of streams where irrigation is used to such an extent as to cause the stream to become dry, or nearly so. Judge Adkins recently made a trip to Austin and worked vigorously on the matter of securing this needed action, and after much wandering about was referred to the House Committee on Irrigation. The Judge appeared before the committee and was instrumental in having the matter brought to the attention of the legislators. The bill calls for irrigation dams built with gates so constructed as to allow the stream its natural flow, the dams to hold only flood waters and overflows. There will be a water meter attached to the gates to enable the person in charge of the dam to see that the regular flow of water is not diminished.
