WATER BONDS TALKED

Some Rousing Addresses in Favor of Water Bonds Made at Mass Meeting of Citizens Tuesday Night.

About fifty citizens showed enough interest in the Mass Meeting called for Tuesday night to respond to the call and lend their presence for the occasion. Of this number over 90 per cent were in favor of the bonds, and showed their appreciation of the good words said for the bond is sue by their liberal applause.

Mayor Conley presided over the meeting and called upon Joe Matthews, J. F. Montgomery, A. B. Reagan, E. L. Jones, D. R. Hardison, C. C. Bumguardner and others for addresses.

Aside from the statements as published in the report of the water committee in last week' issue, the main points brought out in these addresses were that the cost of this bond issue would be but \$12.50 to the man renderng \$5,000 worth of property and proportionate amounts for other property owners, in fact sum so insignificant compared to the great benefits to be deriv ed from the voting of the bond as to render argument upon the subject of cost to the tax payers unnecessary. In view of the fact that the city would b operating its own water system for the good of the community and not for profit, it was argued that the water rates could in time be materially reduced. Another argument in favor of the bonds was that the \$900.00 per year now paid by the city for water would be sufficient to pay interest on \$18,000 of the \$40,000 bonded indebtedness. Also the point was made that the city could secure money at a rate of interest about half of that which a private citizen would be obliged to

Secretary Hardison gave some practical illustrations of the benefits of mnnicipal ownership by referring to Whitesboro where heavy water bills were the cause of much discontent until municipal ownership, when the city was enabled to furnish the same amount of water as used by him belo in Brady, at a cost of 35c to 40c per month. He stated further that the water works company had shown a disposition upon all occasions to deal fairly in the matter and expressed confidence in the ability of the water works committee to make a deal with them without any difficulty. He urgently called upon every citizen to do everything in their power to make the bonds carry.



Grand Jury Report.

Brady, Tex., March, 1911. To the Honorable Jno. W. Goodwin, District Judge:

We, your Grand Jury impaneled for the February Term, 1911, of your Court, beg to submit the following as our report:

We have been in session twelve days, have investigated all violations that have been brought to our knowledge and have returned into your court 8 true bills for felonies and 30 true bills for misdemeanors. We have had summoned before us something over three hundred witnesses and while we find considerable violations of misdemeanor law, we find that most of these violations are committed by transients.

We are glad to say that we find our county almost clear of cattle theft and violation of the Local Option Law. We find that the different officers have been very diligent in the enforcement of the law of every nature.

We have visited the county jail and find seven prisoners confined in jail. We find the prisoners well cared for and the jail well kept. We suggest that there is very much need of an iron door in the partition wall leading from the jailer's quarters to the main entrance to the jail.

We also find some repair is very much needed on the plaster of the jail walls, as the same is cracking and falling off in several places.

We find the courthouse and grounds in fairly good condition with the exception of some repairs needed on the walls of the courthouse, and great need of a private toilet for ladies.
