
Homer T. Wilson.

VALUE OF GOOD ROADS

Brady's Good Roads Movement Features in Special to Dallas News-Improved Highways Increase Valuations.

Frank A. Briggs, Staff Correspondent for the Dallas News, one of the brainiest writers in Texas, visited the Brownwood-Brady-Menard country at the time of the Menard celebration to gather data for a series of articles in the Dallas News featuring this country.
