\$24,960 WATERWORKS

Jacksboro Lets Contract for Complete System of Waterworks Including Powerhouse. Mains, Etc.

Jacksboro, March, 18.-At a recent meeting of the city council of this place a contract was let to W. C. Shaw, of Lawton. Okla, to install a complete system of waterworks here. The contract price was \$24,960 and provides for powerhouse, standpipe, four miles of water mains, fire plugs, etc. Some months ago the wells were drilled and after an exhaustive test, they show a supply of fine artesian water sufficient for a city of 10,000 people. Work will begin at once and will probably be completed before August 1.

Brady will have \$23,000 left out of \$40,000 bonds, after building one dam and bringing the water to the square, with which to build a standpipe and distribute the water over town, if such be the course decided upon.




