Rufus is a handsome Shetland pony, clean built in every particular, with beautiful full mane and foretop, and a tail that sweeps the ground. He is as playful as a kitten, will eat anything from sugar to scraps from the table, and is, in fact, as much of a pet as a lap dog.

He is perfectly gentle, and can be driven by any child. Also be is as good a saddle pony as can be found, having been broken to ride by a cattleman to ride out on the range.

Rufus is as smart as a circus pony and can perform as many tricks as any educated horse. He shakes hands, counts with his feet, stands and walks on his hind legs, will lie down at command, or stand with his front feet on a pedestal.
