



HOUSE GIVES BILL LARGE MAJORITY.

Lowers Duty on Raw Imports From 14 Per Cent to 20 Per Cent Advalorem.

Washington, June 20. - By the decisive vote of 221 to 100 the House this afternoon passed the wool bill. One democrat, Representative Francis, of Ohio, voted against the measure. For the measure were 194 Demoof Wisconsin.

The bill places a duty of 20 per cent advalorem on raw wool imports as against an average duty of a little more than 44 per cent advalorem under the present law. The Ways and Means Committee has estimated the bill would reduce the annual revenue under the woolen schedule of the tariff bill a little more than a million dollars.



The Medina Irrigation Company has purchased 13,000 acres of land which will be placed under irrigation. The company is now building a dam across the Medina river which will be 1360 feet long and 160 feet high and will be one of the largest bridges in the United States.
