





County Superintendent's Notice. The law provides that the County Superintendent of each county shall hold a county teachers' institute of five consecutive days, of seven hours each, within the first four months of each scholastic year, and all teachers under contract to teach in the county at the time the institute is held are required, under penalty of forfeiture of their certificates, to attend the full five days, for which attendance they are entitled to receive pay, according to their contracts, as though they were teaching. The county teachers' institute is recognized, as well as regarded, as a part of the regular school work of the year, the main object of which is the training of the teacher for that particular line of work, which he or she may have for the scholastic year. The State Superintendent requests that the program for said institutes be made out at least one month before the date of holding, and that the teachers and trustees of the county be furnished with a copy of the same. Also that the institute be held at a time when it will least interfere with the fegular sessions of the schools, but that Christmas week, or the week just before the holidays, or any week that would require the closing of all the schools, are the most unsuitable for the holding of said institute. That the teachers shall not only be present at roll call, but for the full seven hours each day, and that the County Superintendent has no legal authority to grant a permit of absence to any teacher. That a failure to attend seven hours of each day, except on account of sickness or other misfortune, shall deprive the teacher of any pay whatever for the entire
