MEETINGS SUSPENDED

PRECAUTIONARY MEASURE BY HEALTH OFFICER,

No Meningitis Cases Developed in Immediate Territory, and No Indications of Any.

Acting under advice from the state health officer, and as a precautionary measure, Dr. J. B. Granville, city health officer, Wednesday ordered the Brady public schools suspended for a period of ten days. Included in the order was the Lyric theatre, churches and Sunday schools, as well as other public meetings or gatherings in Brady.

The following is the letter to Dr. Granville from the state health department:

Austin, Tex., Jan. 8, 1912. Dr. J. B. Granville, City Health Officer, Brady, Texas.

Dear Doctor:

Isolate and place in absolute quarantine all cases Cerebro Spinal Meningitis. On appearance of the disease in your city, close public schools and discourage public gatherings. Insist upon general sanitary measures; clean and disinfect sidewalks, streets and alleys. Carriers convey the disease by means of the nose and throat secretions. Insist upon the enforcement of the anti-spitting an antiseptic spray in the nose oped a case of meningitis. and throat, as a precautionary cars and public conveyances are meetings closed. disinfected.







On July 27, 1908, the restrictions in the state of Oklahoma were removed, giving the Indians the right to sell their lands, which they are selling very rapidly at low prices-from \$15.00 to \$30.00 per acre.
