PROHIBITION ELECTION.

Concho County Antis Want to Vote Whiskey Back.

Commissioners' Court of Concho county, in session this week, ordered a prohibition election to be held throughout the county March 9th. Sixteen years ago, the saloons were voted out of the county, and little effort was made to again test the sentiment of the people in regard to the liquor question until recently. In the Statewide election last July 22d, Concho voted wet by a majority of about 175, and this victory encouraged the antifaction to active steps to get whiskey back. Considerable agitation has been going on for several weeks, and when the commissioners met Monday, a petition with the required list of names attached was presented.
