But before any contract is entered into the proposed builders must give a good and satisfactory bond of at least \$25,000 needed at any time for cuts, to show their good faith and to indemnify the subscribers to the bonus for any expense they may have to incur in getting right-of-way and depot grounds and other expenses incident to the compliance with their part of the contract.


