A BONDED WAREHOUSE

TO MAKE BRADY AN IMPORTANT WOOL CENTER.

H. P. Roddie Bonds Warehouse Under Laws of Texas—Has Leased Frisco Depot.

A move to give Brady the best market in the state for products of all kind, has culminated in a bonded warehouse, and to H. P. Roddie, district and local manager for McCully Co., is due all credit for this great undertaking.

Mr. Roddie has leased the old Frisco freight depot for his warehouse, and has bonded it under the laws of the state of Texas. This will enable him to handle any quantity of wool or other article to be stored to the best advantage, and assures the producers of the very best market in Texas. Insurance is carried on all contents of the warehouse at its present value.

Every citizen of Brady will be interested in the bonding of this warehouse, as it will enable them to keep their products at home within reach, instead of shipping them to some market and thereby placing themselves at the mercy of operators and speculators. Mr. Roddie states that no one will benefit more by reason of the warehouse than the people of this county, and states further that he is in position now to buy or handle anything on consignment.

Mr. Roddie is this week receiving 30,000 pounds of wool from the S. E. McKnight ranch, which is the initial clip of the season, as well as the first to be stored in the new warehouse.

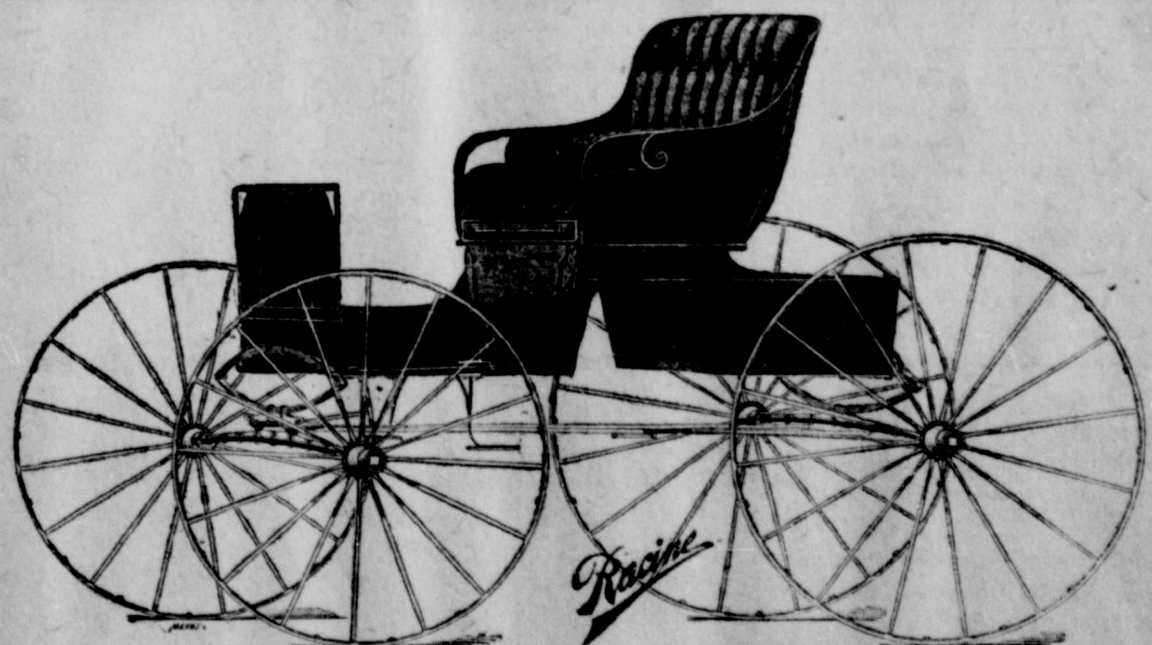
