AGREE ON WATERWORKS

COUNCIL VALUES PROPER-TY AT \$42,250.00.

One Note Payable in Fifteen Years-Electric Light Plant Included in the Estimate.

The city council has reached an agreement with J. H. and G. R. White in the matter of taking over the Brady Water and Light Co.'s plant and property here, the sum total in the agreement being \$42,250. Of this amount, \$30,000 was agreed upon as the value of the water plant, while \$12,250 was the valuation of the light plant. In arriving at these figures Engineer John B. Hawley's figures were taken throughout, with the exception that approximately \$2,000 was deducted for the taking up of the six inch mains within the fire limits, which will have to be replaced with eight inch mains in order to conform to the requirements of the state fire insurance rating laws.
