# WIND AND HAIL STORM

DOES GREAT DAMAGE TO PROPERTY AND CROPS.

Cotton Stripped From Stalks and Beaten Into Ground. Buildings Are Damaged.

A disastrous wind, hail and rain storm visited the north and northeast part of McCulloch county last Thursday, practically wiping out all cotton remaining in the fields, besides doing great damage to property.

The storm covered a strip of country from Coleman in Coleman county to Richland Springs in San Saba county, Santa Anna, Winchell, Milburn and Mercury being in its path. 


