Reports from all parts of the county, as well as from all over this section, indicate that the rain last Thursday and Thursday night was not only most opportune, but that it was the biggest and best since last June, and everyone is rejoicing as a

At Brady the rain fell slowly and steadily all afternoon and practically all night, thoroughly wetting the ground, although the precipitation only amounted to .86 inches. From every part of the county, and from Mason, Eden, Menard, Coleman and Brownwood, the reports give a much heavier rainfall. In the county the average was about three inches. At Lohn the rain was considerably heavier, falling fast and converting the flats amounted a flood, and a total of seven inches rainfall is report-


