SANGER BROS, OF WACO SUCCESSFUL BIDDERS.

The M. Neumegen Racket Stock Brings 43c Tuesday-A. A. Lange of Brady Purchaser.

The Conley Mercantile Co. stock and fixtures was bought Monday by Sanger Bros. of Waco, Mr. Chas. L. Sanger being the successful bidder at 61c. There was some lively bidding on the stock and a number of bidders, both local and out of town. A. A. Lange was a close second to Mr. Sanger, his bid being 591/2c. Dr. M. Jones and Louis Davis of Austin each bid 561/2c. C. Roddy of Cameron was also among the bidders.

The accounts of the Conley Mercantile Co., amounting to over \$900, were not sold, the highest bid being ST, and the court rejecting all bids. Mr. A. Robinson, receiver for the stock, states that the court will itself undertake the collection, and said that joint suit would be brought on the list of accounts.
