BIG RABBIT DRIVE.

Messrs. H. D. and B. W. Bradley were in from Fife Saturday, and reported a big rabbit drive in the Rockwood community a few days previously. The boys were out on the roundup three days, and the first day's work netted them 300, while the second and third days showed about 150 for each day, making a grand total of 600.

Rabbits are numerous in that community, and rabbit drives For trouble work, phone 76, are popular sport, as well as necessary for the protection of the crops. All through Coleman county these drives are made every now and then.

In speaking of the situation, Henry Bradley stated that he was in hopes the commissioners would again place a bounty on rabbit scalps, as the animals were becoming an intolerable pest. In newly ploughed land, they would have beaten trails within a few days, and the farmers are threatened with the loss of their feed crops unless some steps are taken to exterminate the vermin.




