COMMERCIAL CORNER

It has been suggested by some of the leading farmers that we secure a federal expert to look after the grasshopper pest that infest a part of this and parts of adjoining counties, and as the time is approaching when the grasshoppers will. pear, we have no time to lose. as it takes quite a deal of correspondence to secure a federal specialist.

I wish to say to the farmers where the pests usually appear that I would like to be supplied as to the acreage or area of the infested district. And as I know of no better way than for the people who are affected by the pests to tell their respective acreage, I would be glad to have this information at once. This is one of the first questions asked by the government.

Should the government send a man at the time desired the people who are to be benefitted by his investigations will be expected to entertain him while in each neighborhood. This is possibly a small matter, but should be mentioned to save some embarrassment and expense. He will likely be in each community about three days.

I have already made application for a man to come at the time that may be named by the farmers that were affected last season. I feel sure that all will be interested and do their part to help exterminate this pest.

Those who have had no experience in plowing up and replanting the entire crop do not know how expensive it is, or how much trouble, anxiety and hard work it requires to do this.

Two enemies of the farmers should receive attention at this season-rabbits and doves. We are glad that our commissioners court still offers bounty on rabbit scalps, 21/2c and 5c. It does not take a close observer to note the damage that rabbits usuall; do to young orchards, gardens and small crops. Neither does it require careful observation when sowing small grain and also gathering small grain to see how much is wasted by the doves. We used to think that they were a great friend to the farmer by eating their part of the insects, but we have learned a few things. At no time or season do they eat any sort of insect-always seed of some kind. There should be a general war waged on both rabbits and doves at this particular season for both multiply very fast and continue to do so until winter comes again.
