$\qquad$ Brady Country Prof. C. S. Potts of the Uni-
versity of Texas, who delivered the baccalaureate address to the baccalaureate address to
the graduating class of the Brady High school last night, was
a pleasant caller at The Standard office this morning. He ex-
pressed himself as very much pleased with the Brady country
per "Our only trouble in Western
Texas," said he, "is rain. I $i$ we could get the moisture on our land we would have a sort
of paradise, as the soil is fertile ond the climate is fine. We must overcome the handicap of our
semi-arid climate by developing
drouth-resisting crops and by drouth-resisting crops and by
taking care of the water that falls. I expect to live to see the
time when practically all our time when practicaly all our
storm waters will be impounded
in reservoirs and later utilized n irrigation." In speaking of the school sitaation Prof. Potts said: "I was
pleased with the audience that gathered last night in spite of
he threatening weather. It be the schools, which are the best asset any town can have. Froni
what I learn, Brady is to be congratulated on the progress her
chools are making. The University has recently reeognized
this progress by extending ad-
drional affliation on account of drional affiliation on account of
