M. Anderson was presented, approved artd ordered filed: The report showed collection of delinquent city taxes amounting to $\$ 9.46$, and fines of 80 c . <br> The report of City Secretary J. C. McShan for the month of April showing the following balances in the city treasury was presented, approved and ordered filed: General fund, $\$ 3,339.37$; street fund, (overdraft) $\$ 477.70$; bond fund, 86, ,414.09; waterworks sinking fund, $\$ 6,292.86$. <br> Alderman H. P. Roddie was elected mayor pro tem. <br> On account of the street fund having been exhausted, the city secretary. was instructed to transfer the sum of $\$ 1,000$ from the general to that fund. <br> J. H. White and J. T. Mann appeared before the council in an effort to secure an order for the widening of the street to the ice factory from North Bridge. Action on the matter was deferred by the council to the next meeting in order that members of the street committee might personally inspect the premises. <br> An order was passed instruct- | ing the city attorney to force collection of delinquent city taxes due the city. This is the first instance of an order of this kind being passed since the incorporation of the city in 1906. Several thousand dollars in taxes are due, but much of it can never be collected. <br> Lee McShan was appointed a member of the finance committee to succeed H. P.
