J. A. Westbrook of this city has been awarded the contract for the erection of the new parsonage to be built by the East Sweden Presbyterian church about four miles northeast of the city, and will begin the construction Monday morning.

The new building will be located near the church, and will consist of five rooms, bath and porches, and will be strictly modern in design and construction.

The cost, when complete, will be approximately \$1250. Practically all of this sum has been raised by the progressive citizens of the East Sweden community, a small portion of the amount having been subscribed by the business men of Brady, and speaks well for their self-sacrificing and magnanimous spirit.

Regular Session Held on Tuesday Night.

Council met in regular session with Mayor A. C. Baze presiding, and Aldermen Broad, Cook, Roddie, Tipton and Williams present.

Minutes of preceding meeting were read and approved.

Tax Assessor was instructed to strike the White & White waterworks note from the roll of unrendered property.

Motion was made and duly carried that Fire Chief be instructed to buy eight or ten helmets, rubber coats, and boots for the fire department, and that city pay for them, the fire and water committee to approve of the amount to be paid.

Bids were received for city depository. Brady National bank bidding 5 per cent on daily balances and Commercial National bank bidding 7.10 per cent, the latter being the highest bid, the Commercial National bank was named as city depository.

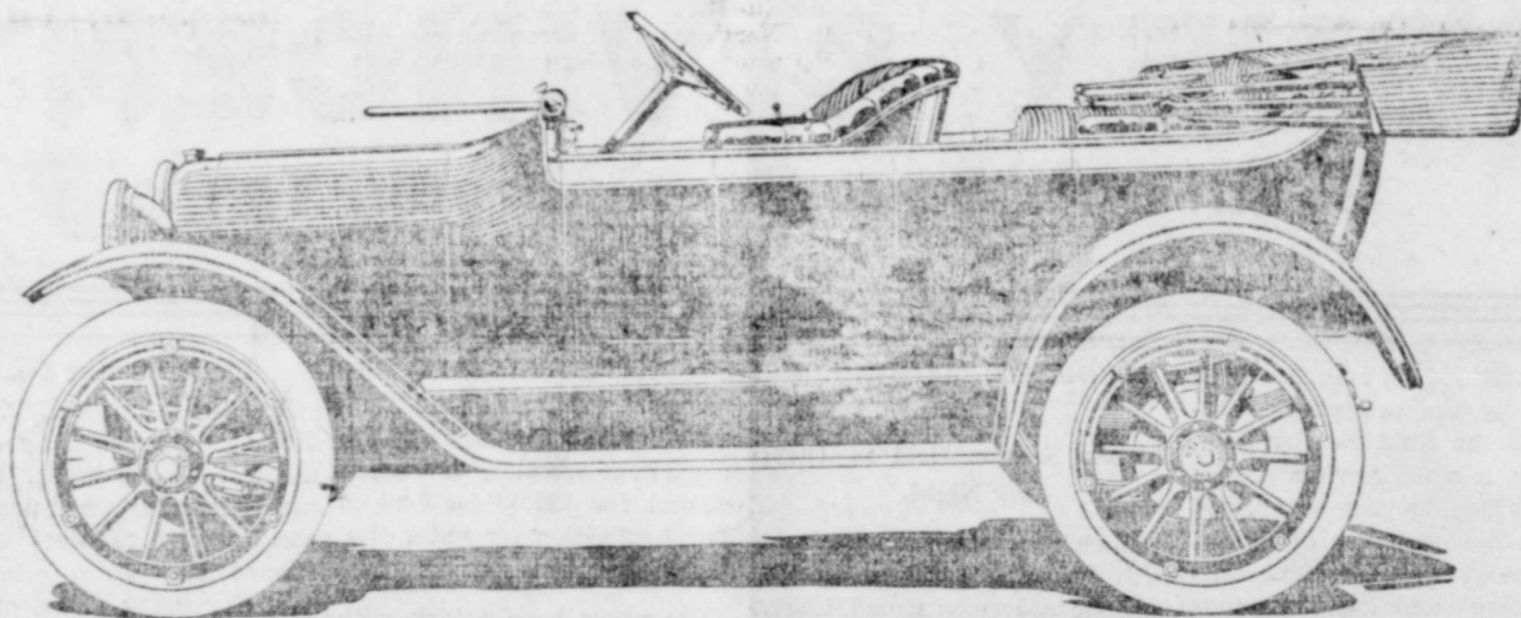
