



Another Effect of the War Leadville, Colo., Nov. 9. -Cadmium, an essential ingredient of very soft metal alloys such as electrical fuses, etc., before the war was heavily exported to the United States from Germany. There are now three American firms making cadmium in one or both its forms. It was known as long ago as 1886 that cadmium was present in the flue and baghouse dust of lead smelters treating ores from Leadville. In another year there will probably be another producer. 
