## C. E. Korth Struck by Stray

 Bullet While Out HuntingWhile out hunting in the C P. Gray pasture, about ten miles south of the city last Friday afternoon, C. E. Korff, a prominent MeCulloch county farmer living nine miles out on
the London road, was struck in the leg by a bullet from a high the leg by a bullet from a high the leg broken.
Just how the accident occurred is hard to explain. Lee Sherrod and Herbert Wood of this city were deer hunting in the vicinity and a short time before the accident, had passed Korff, who was also hunting deer. Sherrod and Wood were

a few minutes after leaving few minutes after leaving Korff cited their quarry and opened fire with their auto-
matic rifles. After shooting matic rifles. After shooting
several times they heard some one calling out that they were shot, and upon going in the direction of the calls found Korff
ying on the ground with a bul let wound in his leg. The bullet entered the side of the leg, about half way between the knee and ankle, passed entirely through the limb and through the sweat leather of the saddle,
