Article VIII of the Constitution of the State of Texas be amended by adding thereto Section 20 to read as follows:

TEXA

Section 20. All building improvements and all other improvements, including fencing and the clearing of land and breaking and reducing same to cultivation lying outside of the boundaries of incorporated cities, towns and villages, shall be exempt from all taxation. and all such lands shall be valued for taxation, whether improved or not, according to the site or raw land value of the same, regardless of any improvements thereon.




