CHARGED WITH ABDUCTION

Arthur McCann Arrested Yesterday-Released on Bond.

Quite a little excitement was occasioned late yesterday afternoon at the court house when the irate parents of a recent bride took bodily possession of the young lady and swore out a warrant for the arrest of the youthful husband on a charge of abduction.

The trouble originated with with the marriage last week of Arthur McCann and a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John Mooring. The parents claim that their daughter is only 13 years of age. They sought to separate the couple Saturday, but their efforts in this direction proved futile, but yesterday afternoon, while the young husband was down town they went to his home and secured possession of their daughter and then swore out a warrant for the arrest of McCann on the abduction


