Cow Ticks Cause Much Loss.

"If tick eradication merely campaign entailing the expenditure of many thousands of dollars would not have been in vain" said J. A. Kiernan, at the State Farmers Institute, last week.

"The increased weight of the cattle alone pays for all the time and money spent. The increase in milk production without any other factor would have justified the undertaking.

"In a practical demonstration conducted by the bureau at Anthony, Florida, it was for hat cows carrying ticks did no up so well in milk flow as those kept free of ticks and did not infeed was increased, as did the tick-free cows.

"At the close of the experiment the cows lightly infested with ticks were producing 18.6 per cent less milk than the cows Ragland Writes Interesting kept free from ticks-practically & Sons. one pint and a half less per cow
