NEARLY 4,000,000 BALES UN-DER LAST YEAR.

Condition in Texas Only 69-Slump Results From Oversold Cotton on Market.

New York, Aug. 30 .- Cotum broke violently on the floor of the cotton exchange today upon Mrs. L. Bradley and son, B. of the bureau of agriculture.

WOMAN'S HOME MISSION SOCIETY.

Wiler H. Swift, child labor secretary for North and South Carolina, says:

"When I consider what remains to be done for the protection of the children in North and South Carolina, I am forced to conclude that up to the present we have not progressed, very far. North and South Carolina have a larger per cent of child workers in the manufacturing industry than any other state in the Union. If the persons engaged in these industries should march by, every ninth person would be a child under sixteen. These children leave school forever at twelve-often younger in North Carolina, where there is practically no law enforcement -to work eleven hours a day in our factories.

"Public opinion grows slowly, and law halts behind public opinion. The people of these states, as a whole, deplore the conditions under which children are working, and yet it is my firm belief that neither North Carolina nor South Carolina, if left to herself, will enact any real storage room at their gin for the child-labor legislation within the accommodation of their customnext eight years.
