

Hugh Nugent Fitzgerald of the Fort Worth Record says that the live stock industry is at a loss annually of \$80,000,000 on account of the tick, and he says why, in addition to this, refuse to band together for the extermination of the tick. All the answer that I can give is not the little expense attached to the dipping, but the trouble of handling the stock. They prefer letting the cattle and the ticks have it out. 
