> WHITEWASH FOR OUTSIDE USE.

(Clip this for Future Use.) For gates and fences a good whitewash recipe is the follow-

Slake twenty pounds of unslaked lime with boiling water until it is of the consistency of thin cream. Then stir in three pounds of common salt and onehalf pound of alum.

Another good recipe for whitewash for outdoor use is the following:

To twelve pounds of lime add ten ounces of soft soap. Slake where he had been making his two pounds of common salt and slowly, stirring all the time. This will make ten gallons of

The government whitewash, which has given quite general satisfaction, is more expensive than the above, but is more satisfactory.

Slake a half bushel of lime with boiling water, keeping it covered during the process. Strain it and add a peck of salt dissolved in warm water, three pounds of ground rice put in boiling water and boiled to a thin paste, one-half pound of Get an L. & P. spring. They powdered Spanish whiting, one pound of clear glue dissolved in warm water. Mix these well together and let the mixture stand for several days. Keep the wash thus made in a kettle or portable heater, and when used put it on as hot as possible with painter's brush or whitewash brush.


