CONCHO RANCH DEAL

G. R. WHITE LEASES KICKA-POO RANCH.

Also Purchases All Livestock on Property From Sam H. Henderson-\$275,000 Involved

San Angelo, Dec. 3 .- One of the largest deals consummated in the San Angelo country in many months was closed last Tuesday, when Sam H. Henderson leased his Kickapoo ranch for a period of five and one-half years and sold all livestock on the property to G. R. White of Brady. The consideration was approximately \$275,000.

Delivery is to be completed within ten days from the date on which the deal was closed. Mr. Henderson is actively retiring from the ranch business, although he still retains large holdings in Schleicher county. He makes his home in this city.
