





To the Editor of The Standard: The warehouse and marketing department desires to state, in answer to many inquiries and for the benefit of all concerned, that that part of the law pertaining to bagging, as prescribed in section 6 of the law, which is mandatory and reads as follows, will be enforced to the letter the coming season:

"Sec. 6. Each and every bale of cotton ginned by a public gin in this state shall be wrapped in bagging so as to completely cover same, and leave none of the cotton exposed. 
