Agriculture say, has now been Agriculture say, has now been
demonstrated to be a good and palatable food for dairy cows, The cost of feeding prickiy Prickly pears have been fed to local conditions. There is cattle to some extent in Texas and Mexico for many years, out
their value as a feed has not their value as a feed has not
been fully appreciated. Recent experiments by the Department
of Agriculture have shown, however, that this feed can be
used much more extensively and can form a much larget
proportion of the ration than was believed possible heretofore. The results of these experiments, says an article in the Au-
gust issue of the Journal of Agricuitural Research, indicate
that there is no reason why prickly pears should not cume ctioneral use for feed in all matic and soil conditions the prickly pear is a perfectly prac-
ticable farm crop. At Brownsville, Texas, the average annual
yield for the first two years' 40 tons, and at San Antonto
about 25 tons an acre. After the first two years a yield of
50 to 100 per cent more can ve expected. Irrigation is unnec-
essary and the cost of growing the crop is therefore small in comparison
