J. D. Benson, who lives north of town, has a vast kaolin field on his farm, the exact extent of has been roughly estimated as of kaolin. Mr. Benson has known recently made experiments as Funeral services were held to its extent. A hole drilled with a post hole auger about half a mile from the known mile distant in another direction, also brought like results.

> Upon taking the matter up mercial value, such value being dependent upon the quality of the kaolin and its location with reference to transportation and marketing facilities.


