The fenders were crumpled up, the windshield smashed into bits, the top torn and broken and the body of the car dented and disfigured. The occupants of the car escaped luckily, Turner having a cut on his arm and another member or the party getting a cut across the face from the broken windshield. Aside from this, none were injured beyond slight bruises and a general shaking up. The car was righted and brought into

town under its own power.
