Passed Away Wednesday Morning After Brief Illness.

The death of Mrs. R. B. Mc-Clure occurred Wednesday at 6:20 a. m., following an illness of only a few days. A very severe case of lagrippe, which resulted from a cold contracted the lattetr part of last week was the cause of demise. 




