STAR ROUTE CHANGES.

Beginning December 18th Fife Gets Daily Mail.

As announced in our correspon dence from Fife this week, the Waldrip Star route will, on December 18, be routed via Fife, and the short star route line from Fife to Lohn and return will be discontinued. The change is hailed with delight by the citizens of the Fife community, inasmuch as it will give them daily mail both incoming and outgoing. 




