RECORD COLD SPELL

MERCURY DROPS NEARLY SIXTY DEGREES.

Thermometer Registered 12 Degrees Above Zero Thursday Morning, Freezing All Day

The coldest spell of the season went on record Thursday morning when a temperature of 12 degrees above zero was recorded about town, and 16 degrees was officially registered at the 916 Queen hotel. The coldest weath-552 er heretofore recorded was 22 24 dgrees above zero.

Following the summer-like weather of Tuesday and Wednesday, the change registered a 150 sheer drop in temperature of about 60 degrees from Wednesday afternoon, when the thermometer register d over 70 degrees until Thursday morning's





To the American People: The Secretary of the Navy has awarded contracts amounting to over \$3,000,000 to a British bidder for 14 and 16-inch projectiles for the Navy because of very much lower prices offered by the English

We know nothing of the basis upon which the British bids were made, but the pub-lic is entitled to know the facts upon which we ourselves bid for this work.

to make 4,200 14-inch shells at a price of \$1,515,000. Up to now not a single shell has been accepted by the Government, although we have expended, in wages, materials, etc., on these orders \$522,881, and we have not received a SINGLE DOLLAR on these contracts.

In addition, a literal interpretation of the contract might make us liable for penalties amounting to \$678,016.

In the light of our experience, and having no other basis, we bid for 16-inch shells approximately the same rate per pound as that which the Navy Depart actually awarded a 14-inch shell contract one year ago.
