Life in the Officers Reserve
Cmp at Camp Funston (Leon Springs) is graphically describ-
ed by E. E. Murphy, in the San Angelo Standard, Mr. Murphy in company with four others,

regulation shirts, and a fatigue blouse
which must be worn in the even-
ing. ing. The camp is kept in a perfect
sanitary condition. There is a
. post office, a quartermaster depot, on the grounds. The bank
and commissary are operated by and commissary are operated by
the government on the profit-
sharing basis and all used in procuring better food. "The physical examination is
