## Telephone Service



Brady's new central battery switchboard was cut into service at an early hour Monday morning, June 25th. The transfer was made in a comparatively short time and little or no trouble was experienced, which was due to the careful preparations going on for sev-

The installation of the new telephones, which form a part of the central battery equipment, is now going on and all of the telephones will be installed within the next few days.

After this is done, the old plant will be dismantled and the finishing touches put on the outside plant. Brady will then have a telephone system equal to any town of its size in the State of Texas.

We will also then be prepared to handle all orders promptly and it is suggested that those desiring service over the new system, leave their order with the manager at once and same will be handled as soon as pos-


