An election for the purpose An election for the purpose of bonds to be used in enlarging Brady's water supply, has been
called for the second Tuesday in called for the second Tuesday in
January, being January 8th, and all qualified voters of the city of
Brady will be entitled to Brady will be entitled to vote for r against the measure.
The proposition of voting on The propos:tion of voting on
the question of bonds to enlarge the Brady water supply has been under consideration by leading citizens for some time, and at
the meeting of the Brady city council Tuesday the matter wa brought before that body for ac tion, with the result that the councilmen voted u
all the election.
The one idea in voting bonds is to increase Brady's water supply, and whether the most feasi ble plan is to enlarge the pres
ent dam, build a dam on Bowie creek, or to adopt some other plan, remains to be determined
That $\$ 25,000$ will not be ade quate to accomplish this im provement is weil understood
but it is the largest sum permis sible under the city's present in debtedness. Leading citizens,
however, whose financial interhowever, whose financial inter-
ests in Brady are heaviest, have may be to supply whar addition to the bonds, and the local banks have agreed to buy the bonds,
which assures ample funds for which assures ample funds for
the enterprise, should the citizens vote in favor of the propo sition.
