## McCULLOCH BEST ADVERTISED AND FAMED COUNTY IN STATE

### OPEN-AIR MEETING MONDAY WILL DECIDE FUTURE WORK OF C. OF C.

**SHALL THE WORK OF THE BRADY CHAMBER OF COMMERCE BE CARRIED ON OR ABANDONED.**

Farmers and townsmen, land-owners and lease-holders, citizens and non-residents of McCulloch county are invited — nay, urged, and expected—to be present at the open-air meeting to be held on the courthouse lawn next Monday afternoon from 2:00 to 4:00 o'clock, at which time it will be decided whether or not the work of publicity and advertising of McCulloch county, her resources in general and the oil field in particular, shall be carried on.

Of such importance is the meeting considered that the entire town will be closed during this period, and every business and professional man of Brady is pledged not only to drop his business during this period, but is also pledged to attend the meeting.

Plans for the meeting were made at a gathering held last Monday night at the courthouse, and which made up for its lack of numbers by the enthusiasm of those present. There were a number of speakers on the program, and all made interesting addresses.

Judge Evans Adkins, as head of the commissioners who attended the good roads meeting at Mineral Wells, made a report and explained the proposed amendment to the state constitution which would enable the state to issue \$75,000,000 in bonds for the purpose of building hard surfaced roads throughout the state.

M. S. Sellers, who also attended the meeting as representative of the Brady Chamber of Commerce also made a report, and told of the fame that had come to Brady and McCulloch county through the publicity

campaign of the Brady Chamber of Commerce, and through the widespread distribution of the McCulloch county oil maps. The maps carried to Mineral Wells by Mr. Sellers were in great demand, and were eagerly sought by the visitors there.

The hit of the evening, however, was made by the stirring address of Sam McCollum, who, by reason of his personal contact with various deals in the oil game, is thoroughly conversant with the results obtained by the Chamber of Commerce for McCulloch county citizens. Mr. McCollum presented off-hand, a comprehensive account of how values had jumped since the opening gun of the Chamber of Commerce campaign was fired. While it is impossible to repeat all of Mr. McCollum's facts and figures, the following is offered our readers for their careful considera-

tion: No less than a million dollars have been paid for oil leases in McCulloch county, and the money thus expended has been the means of pulling the citizens and businesses through a year that most otherwise have brought disaster to all alike.

The money spent here for leases has enabled the banks to carry on their business almost as usual, and has enabled them to give much valuable and timely aid to the citizens. Business in every line has been improved from 25 per cent to 200 per cent.

Acreage that had been forfeited at 50c rental before the Brady Chamber of Commerce publicity campaign was launched, has since brought \$10 and some as high as \$15 per acre, exclusive of the returns from the sale of royalty contracts and in addition to the royalty retained by the land owner.

The Brady Chamber of Commerce has conducted an extensive paid advertising campaign, which has heralded the McCulloch county oil field to all parts of the U. S., and in connection has secured thousands of dollars worth news stories and publicity.

Has had printed and distributed 20 or 25 thousands of maps of McCulloch county, which have been declared the most remarkable and successful advertising ever done by any county. No other county in the state has sent out maps free.

Has ready for distribution circulars and advertising literature for McCulloch county, which is designed to be enclosed in letters sent out by the business and professional men of the

county. Has originated a register at the C. of C. office, which enables the listing of lands for leasing, and which is open to inspection by any visiting or local oil man or investor. This service is also free.

Is arranging an oil exhibit to be placed at the Queen hotel, which will include large-size pictures of the various rigs operating in the county, samples of oil and formations drilled through.

Has arranged a bulletin board on which the needs of both investors and local citizens may be bulletined free of charge.

Has planned a campaign of information, by which the general public will be kept informed as to what the C. of C. is doing and accomplishing.

The foregoing is but a brief sketch of what has and is being done. The half will never be told. But the cream of the coconut is this: The work of the Brady Chamber of Commerce has been carried on by and through the efforts and financial assistance of a comparative few citizens of McCulloch county. Unless the citizenship in general unites in co-operating and assisting in the work, those who have blazed the trail are ready to turn back and abandon the work.

Every citizen should feel it his duty and find it to his interest to attend the Open-air meeting next Monday afternoon from 2:00 to 4:00. Let there be no slackers. McCulloch county needs every shoulder to the wheel now to help her and her citizens reap the full benefits of the work already accomplished.

### AEROPLANE TO MAKE EXHIBITION FLIGHTS AT BRADY ON SATURDAY

**WILL SCATTER VICTORY LOAN LITERATURE—OPPORTUNITY TO RIDE IN AEROPLANE.**

The following telegram has been received by W. D. Crothers from O. L. Chenowets, of the War Loan Organization department at Dallas:

"Plane will land in your town 10:00 a. m. Saturday, April 26th, for exhibition. Man and woman selling most bonds may go up in aeroplane."

The aeroplane is one of numbers that are being sent out over the state to advertise and promote the sale of bonds for the Fifth Victory loan. As will be noted from the telegram, the man and woman selling the most bonds will have the privilege of riding in the plane. Another feature of the exhibition flight is that thousands of leaflets will be scattered from the aeroplane during its flight, and such of these leaflets as have special marks will entitle the finder to a German helmet.

The sale of the Victory bonds opened Monday, April 21st and will continue until May 21st. McCulloch county's quota of the \$4,000,000,000 or more bonds to be sold is \$48,600. There are three different issues of these bonds, and which carry two different rates of interest, 4 3-4 per cent and 3 3-4 per cent, the last-named being not subject to taxation.

The flight of the aeroplane over Brady will be the means of attracting many citizens from all parts of the county to Brady tomorrow, and should be the means of arousing great interest in the Victory loan. The landing grounds south of the stock pens have been cleared and marked in readiness for the plane, and this will enable all who wish to get a close-up view of the machine.

#### BRADY WINS WELL PLAYED GAME FROM MASON MONDAY BY SCORE OF 8 TO 3




**FAIRVIEW-LIVE OAK ITEMS.**
