FIRE DESTROYS BRADY STEAM LAUNDRY SUNDAY NIGHT - TOTAL LOSS

ORIGIN OF BLAZE UNKNOWN—SUBSTANTIAL BUILDING CAUSES FIRE TO ILLUMINATE SKY FOR MANY MILES AROUND-LOSS IS HEAVY-BUT \$4,000 INSURANCE.

Brady suffered a disastrous loss Sunday evening in the total destruction by fire of the Brady Steam Laundry. The fire, of unknown origin, was discovered about 7:30 o'clock, when the flames burst through the building. For some 30 minutes prior to the discovery, a man on the Brady square had noticed the smoke and an illumination without being able to tell just what it was. When the first persons arrived on the scene, almost the entire building was a roaring mass of flames and beyond any hope of salvaging. The fire boys responded, but their intake pipe lacked about 20 ft. of reaching from the top of the bluff to the water in the creek, and all they could do was to use the chemical hose in saving the boiler house from the flames.


