HENDERSON FAVORS VOTING FOR AMENDMENT <br> TO ENABLE BETTER SCHOOLS <br> Editor Brady Standard: <br> I notice there are thouands of our teachers quitting teaching on the account of small salarios. They can get better wages at most any other employment. We pay ail we can, but we can't pay enough to hold them. <br> What does this moan? It means that our children will be deficient in education, and the childran of today will be the power of the nation tomorrow; and if our chaldren are de-ficient-that means wo have a defective , government. <br> Is there any remedy for this trouBle? I think there is. <br> There is an amendmeat to be roted on next election. This amendment provides a small tax in addition to our 50 c tax if we mant it. Voting this amendment doesn't vota the tax; it orly provides the right to vote the tax if you want it. <br> Now don't get the idea in your head that if you vote for the amendment you vote a raise in your tax. You vote for the amendmont first and if that earries, then if your noighbor district wants to vote a little raise to maintain a good school that gives them the right to rote the tax in their district. This affocts each district separately. I sppeal to each voter to stady this proposition. | member when you vote for the amendment you don't vote for the tax raise directly. 1 know some will faint if you name a tax raise, but I believe thiere are enough educators in the State to carry this amendment. If there isn't, I feel bad for our Lone Star state. <br> Our teachers' will have to be paid more. When the government was normal the salaries were fairly good -not too much then, but now they can't teach for what we pay them. <br> Before the war you could get shoes for five and six dollars; now you pay ten and twelve dollars. Y. | FRISCO PASSENGER <br> DEPOT AT BROWNWOOD RE-OPENED MARCH IST <br> At one minute past midright last night, or rather this morning, the federal government turned the management and control of the railroad business back to private ownership. The only change noticeable at Brownwood was the resumption of passenger business by the Frisco railroad at their own depot between Center and Main Avenues, for the first time since August 18th, 1918, at which time the government took charge of the railroads. <br> The Frisco celebrated the change in a striking way. The last passenger train operated by the government came in Sunday thirteen hours late while the first to come in under private ownership and management came in on time today. <br> Of course this might have been due to Providential matters, but it is of striking nature, taking place as it did at this particular time.
