CONVENTION ENDORSES DEMOCRATIC ADMINISTRATION

PRECINCTS SEND DELEGATES TO COUNTY CONVENTION

Applied to anti-administration forces in Brady last Saturday afternoon, not only endorsing the Democratic delegates to the county convention effort and diligence to see that electing delegates to the State convention as a delegate to the Democratic not favor and give unqualified endorsement, both in peace and in

The Brady precinct convention was presided over by J. E. Shropshire, who had been duly appointed and selected by the Democratic Executive Committee of McCulloch county. Mrs. Nina White was elected secretary of the convention. Following organization of the convention, the following proceedings were had:

J. E. Shropshire, F. M. Newman, W. Cowan, Mrs. Nina White, Mrs. J. Howard, John Savage and T. P. were duly nominated and elected as delegates from said precinct to the County Democratic Convention of McCulloch county.

L. Craddock, Joe Adkins, Miss Steffner, Rev. J. H. Taylor and Sam McCollum, were selected by the precinct convention as a committee to draft suitable resolutions for the present National administration, and said committee drafted and submitted to the convention the hereinafter resolutions which were unanimously adopted by said precinct convention, said resolutions being as follows:

IT RESOLVED by the Democracy of Voting Precinct No. 1 of McCulloch county, Texas, in this Precinct convention duly assembled:

That we heartily approve the great achievements of our Democratic National administration under the leadership of Woodrow Wilson, and in war, and we favor its full endorsement by the Democratic National convention to be held in San Francisco, both in the platform and in the resolutions adopted and in the election of President and Vice President by such convention.

Second: That we instruct our delegates to the County convention to vote for resolutions instructing the delegates from this county to the State convention to vote for no person for delegate from Texas to the Democratic National convention who does not favor and support all the principals and purposes expressed in this resolution;

Third: That we direct our delegates to the County convention to vote as a unit on all questions submitted to them by such County convention for consideration.

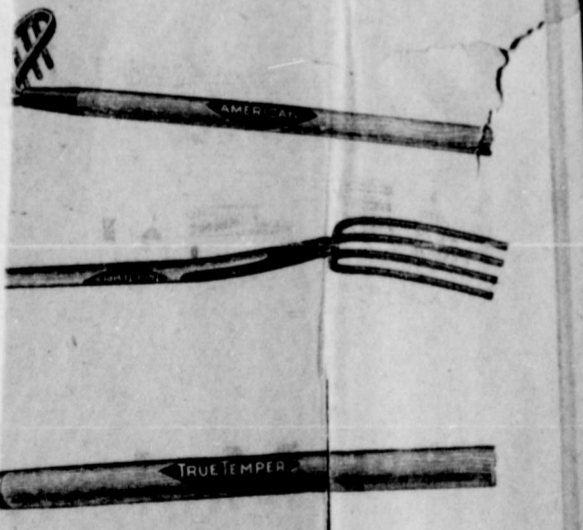

HIGHEST PRICES IN ITS HISTORY

The highest prices ever paid for sheep and wool in the history of the industry in West Texas are reflected in sales which were obtained in San Angelo Thursday morning. Long wools have brought as high as 72 cents, or eight cents per pound higher than ever before known, while bred ewes, with the wool on, have commanded from \$16 to \$25. Numerous flocks of lambs have been contracted for at \$10, delivery to be made at weaning time in the fall.

Coming Into Their Own.

Thus, after three years of hardships, due to the drouth, the sheep and wool growers have at last come into their own, and predictions are being made freely that before the season is over choice wool clips will command \$1 a pound.

Information considered reliable was received Thursday from Sonora to the effect that W. A. Miers had refused 90c a pound for his twelve months' wool and Tom B. Adams, ex-sheriff of Sutton county, had rejected an offer of 85c a pound. Miers is said to have about 15,000 sheep and probably 150,000 pounds of wool. Gets 90 Cents for Wool.

Max Marschall of San Angelo, who ranches twelve miles north of San Angelo, is the only man, so far as is known, who has been paid 90c for his wool. Marschall recently sold the fleece from 600 sheep, amounting to between 6,500 and 7,000 pounds, at this top figure. He disposed of the sheep at the same time, it is understood.

The highest confirmed price heretofore has been 68c per pound. This was paid at Sonora by H. P. Roddie & Co. of San Angelo for 50,000 pounds of wool bought from Holland Brothers. Some of the clips in the 90,000 pounds of fleece disposed of here by the Wool Growers' Central Storage Company early this week is reported to have brought 72c. The statement was made that the prices were the highest yet recorded, but the exact figures were not announced.—San Angelo Standard.

DISTRICT COURT AT SAN SABA BREAKS RECORD— FIVE MISTRIALS HAD

San Saba, Texas, May 1.—The spring term of the District Court of this county, just ended, was remarkable in several respects. For the first time in the history of the county civil and criminal dockets were so long that the court adjourned the full term of three weeks. Judge N. T. Stubbs, presiding, disposed of more civil and criminal cases and general court business in any term held heretofore.

Trials occurred, which is a new record. The largest number of mistrials was in the case of Otto Stalley, vs. W. Gray, suit on note, being awarded \$102,100.

W. W. WILLBANKS SUSTAINS SLIGHT FIRE DAMAGE AT RESIDENCE SUNDAY

Fire about 10:00 o'clock Sunday morning burned a good-sized hole in the roof of the W. W. Willbanks' residence in the west part of town, and resulted in other slight damage. The fire alarm was sounded just about an hour after the standpipe and all the water mains had been drained of water to permit cleaning. The pumps were at once started, and within ten or fifteen minutes after the alarm had sounded, water was again in the mains. The fire boys made a quick run, but found little to be done, as Mr. Willbanks, with the aid of water that had been drawn in tubs, and by cutting away the burning portions of the roof, had already gotten the blaze pretty well under control.

The origin of the fire is unknown, as the flue was of substantial sheet iron construction. It is presumed sparks from burning soot fell on the roof and ignited the shingles. A hole about four feet square was burned and some water damage resulted. The entire loss, however, will not exceed ten or fifteen dollars.
