



The body of Carey Kennedy, victim of accidental shooting at Great Lakes, Ill., arrived Monday morning, and was carried to the home of the boy's father, E. B. Kennedy, at Waldrip, where funeral services will be held this (Tuesday) afternoon at 3:00 o'clock, Rev. L. S. Richardson being in charge. Interment is to be made in the cemtery at Marion.

No further particulars of the tragedy have become known by relatives or friends here, and aside from the original telegram stating that the boy had been shot through the breast, nothing has been learned. The body was shipped without delay, apparently, as four days were required to make the trip, which allowed but one day for preparation of the body for shipment following the lad's death Wednesday morning of last week. So Spillers traversed the five-mile unfar as is known, no military escort was given the body.


