A complete surprise was given local oil men Monday evening when Clyde Hall phoned in the news that Thad O. Day well No. 2 was flowing over the top. A hurried trip to the well site resulted in confirmation of this report, and the further discovery that when a plug was removed from the top of a pipe, a steady flow of pure oil resulted. This well was shot with 20 quarts of nitro-glycerine several weeks ago, and later a second shot of 50 quarts was given the well. Further operations were then suspended pending receipt of an engine to pump the well.
